



Creating and Using Digital Content



[Project Gutenberg](#)

Light literature (such as Alice in Wonderland, Peter Pan, or Aesop's Fables), heavy literature (such as Moby Dick or Paradise Lost), and references (such as almanacs, encyclopedias, or dictionaries) in down-loadable formats.

[Lit2Go](#)

is a free online collection of stories and poems in Mp3 (audio-book) format. You can: Download the files to your Mp3 player, listen to the Mp3 files on your computer, view the text on a webpage and read along as you listen or print out the stories and poems to make your own book.

Finding Non-Fiction Text

CK12

CK-12 allows educators to customize and produce content by re-purposing to suit what needs to be taught, using different modules that may suit a learner's learning style, region, language, or level of skill, while adhering to the local education standards. They call it Flexibility + Textbook = Flexbook.

CK-12 Foundation is a non-profit organization with a mission to reduce the cost of textbook materials for the K-12 market both in the U.S. and worldwide. With its open-content, web-based collaborative model, CK-12 intends to pioneer the generation and distribution of high quality educational content that will serve both as core text as well as provide an adaptive environment for learning.

Bookshare

The Bookshare library provides print disabled people in the United States with legal access to over 41,000 books and 150 periodicals that are converted to Braille, large print or digital formats for text to speech audio. Free to All U.S. Students with Qualifying Disabilities
